





Help Mount Vernon Keep Our Central Library Status Meeting Thursday, July 13, 2017

6:00 pm - Mount Vernon Public Library **Grace Green Baker Community Room** The Mount Vernon Public Library has been designated the Central Library for Westchester County

for sixty years. Gary Newman, head of the library's Reference Department, has boldly called out the Westchester Library System board for what he believes motivates the thought of relinquishing Mount Vernon's status as the Central Library. Mr. Newman shared this with the committee at a meeting held on May 18, 2017: "I became aware very early on of how much the perceptions of Mount Vernon as Central Library were shaped by racial apprehensions. Mount Vernon is a great Central Library, with great staff and great resources, but I have been told hundreds of times, by librarians throughout the county, that their patrons do not like to go down there." The Library Board of Trustees, Interim Director Ms. Evania Thompson, library staff and community

advocates have been on a mission to retain the library's designation as the Central Library of Westchester County, NY. The Mount Vernon Public Library has been designated the Central Library for Westchester County for sixty years. The Central Library Study Committee will gather information related to Central Library activities and roles in the Westchester Library System, a network of 38 member libraries throughout Westchester County. The Mount Vernon Public Library has a collection of approximately 400,000 materials. This makes the library the largest collection in Westchester County, an accomplishment worthy of Central Library status. Let Our Voices Be Heard!




